The Darkest Valley | Part 2

As Jesus journeyed towards Jerusalem, He wept and He prayed, "Father, if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine." Luke 22:42. Even though He knew He was suffering for the Kingdom's sake, Jesus felt the fear and the grief just as we do when we walk through a Dark Valley. Begin your study by reading Luke 22:39-46.
